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Brief background of the organization

Gender Education, Empowerment & Leadership Organization (GEELO) is a social a non-profit- organization whose work is focused towards protecting and empowering **women** and **children** (particularly the girl child, street children and marginalized youth) from vulnerable background across the Somali society. With this, GEELO seeks to promote sustainable health, social and economic development by engaging the local communities in all community-based approach for resilience building, growth and development.

Founded by a group of Somali women professionals to respond to the plight of the vulnerable members of the community as a result of the civil war, **GEELO** is registered in Italy; **C. F. 97503980159 number** and **OP.218/051/2009/066/5563 in Kenya** with most of her activities in Hiran, Beletweyne and Mogadishu Somalia.

Speared headed by Zahra Mohamed Abtidon, also a cofounder of Association "MAMME E BIMBI SOMALI registered in 1994; Milan Italy. GEELO acknowledges that women, children and youth are the most vulnerable members of the community from all sorts of calamities and in consequently deny them the basic human rights where their resilience is incapacitated.

Our Strategy

GEELO targets areas where women and girls or poor people's needs are greatest and our available resources can best help. GEELO aims to be the catalyst for change, identifying and facilitating new frontiers for sustainable improvement of the lives of the vulnerable lot through participatory processes.

With the support of international donors and the assistance of local partners, GEELO helps individual women and girls from vulnerable groups and the rural poor to emerge from poverty through Education, vocational training, improvement in Hygiene and Sanitation and Advocacy for human rights - for instance, the right to say no to FGM. Prevention and awareness of Epidemic diseases such as: Cholera, Malaria, TB, and HIV/AIDS.GEELO also plans to support the above-mentioned groups with clean water, medicine, food, Cash transfer productive animals, seeds for crops, livestock vaccination and any other related assistance on livestock and crop development. GEELO also run women empowerment programs aimed at promotion of women participation in local and national decision-making processes and competitive political positions both at the local and national levels. GEELO also provide primary health care services through a network of health centers and mobile clinic.

GEELO provides primary aid including primary health care- health centers, mobile clinic and ambulance services, community health/sanitation and hygiene and advocate for the rights of women, girls, street children, IDPs and marginalized youth who leave in the urban and rural areas of Hiran region, who may fall in the following categories; Orphan girls, Single mothers, Street girls/twilight girls and street children, Sexually abused women and girls (GBV), Drug addicted women and girls e.g. khat in Somalia, Support education and economic empowerment of Girls from poor backgrounds, Un educated youth, Marginalized families like: Bantus, landless/squatters and peasant, Pastoralists & Agro-pastorals, IDPs, etc

Network/Membership; UN, Somalia Cluster, Health, Nutrition, Food security, Logistics , Protection, Groups, CSO Coordination groups and Joint Emergency surveillance Forum.

Operations/Management

In an effort to carry out its mandate to the vulnerable sections of the Somali society, GEELO is run by a representative board of directors whose policies are implemented by a technical team of managers headed by an Executive Director.

GEELO works with local communities, local and regional administrations, other civil society organizations, international organizations, UN agencies and other partners to ensure her mission of empowering and engendering women, children and youth resilience is achieved whilebuilding on their resilience.

Both the managers and the board of directors are highly experienced with the socio-historical dimensions of the Somali society. They have a deep understanding of the effective changes in Somalia especially as a result of the impact of the social conflicts brought about by these emingly never-ending conflict and effects of ravaging droughts, floods and famines.

Mechanism for Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring

GEELO organization has established a strong monitoring system to ensure that all programmatic interventions attain the pre-set objectives of the organization. The project officers and the Field Coordinators do continuous monitoring of project activities. The Program Manager also regularly visits the sites to ascertain the effectiveness and efficiency of the activities being undertaken.

The stakeholders are also involved in the monitoring exercise through participatory stakeholder engagement processes. The project officers also present monthly progress reports to the Field Coordinator. The Field Coordinator will then, on regular basis, compile and send reports to the Program Manager.



Evaluation

Self-Evaluation:

Those involved in carrying out the activities carry out continuous self-evaluation. These include the local staff and volunteers. From time to time, they sit together to reflect on their own progress and retrogression in relation to the pre-set objectives and assess their strengths and weaknesses.

Periodic Evaluation

The management including the Field Coordinator, project officers and representatives of the beneficiaries carry out periodic project evaluation as per the respective donor's needs and funding conditions. Environmental impacts of each project are also given due regarded.

Annual Evaluation

Annual evaluation will be carried out by experts to ascertain the viability and cost-effectiveness of all projects. Impact assessments are also carried out both internally and externally.

Potential Scaling up

With its current activities in the greater Hiran region, GEELO anticipates to extend its activities to all parts of Somalia funds and security permitting.

As we continue to expand our programs to meet the varying needs of the vulnerable groups, we ensure that we operate in line with the mission of the organization. GEELO strives strengthening her partnership with other civil society alliances and pressure groups extending relations with international organizations and networks, thereby expanding her recognition as a humanitarian organization.

GEELO's Sustainability Approach

GEELO ensures that the target communities own the programs. Towards this end GEELO ensures that capacities of the local communities are built. This is done through training and workingwiththelocalcommitteestodevelopskillsinmanagement, maintenance, administration and financial operations. This enables the local committees/councils to sustain the programs (when donor funding is over) as they are empowered to take over and sustain projects.



GEELO Organizational Structure

The governing structure of the organization is as follows:

1. Founding members

The founding members are the supreme authority of the organization and are the decision makers. The founding members issue resolutions on the general policy, planning and implementation strategies of the organization.

The founding members approve the constitution and elect the Board of Directors to run the overall activities of the organization for three years of the office mandate.

2. Board of Directors

The board of Directors shall adopt resolutions pertaining to administration and managerial matters as well as setting of guidelines, policies and programs pertaining to the short, medium and long term running of the organization.

- a) The board shall oversee the proper implementation of the policies and plans bycomplying with pertinent objectives of the organization.
- b) The board shall invest more executive power in the CEO and provide him/her an appropriate delegation of authority to act on its behalf as far as entering into agreement in and outside Somalia and signing of promissory notes, money deposits withdrawals from the accounts and all other procurement are concerned.
- c) The CEO shall be the chairman of the board and preside over the meetings from time and time during his/her term in office.
- d) The board shall hold regular meetings at least once in every three months, any informal meetings shall be called either by the chairman or at the request of two third the members of the board.
- e) The board is the top decision-making organ of GEELO and the decision-making process shall be by majority vote of its members who will have one vote each.

3. The Management


Thefunctions of the managementare related to the managers must execute the instructions and the job descriptions issued to them by the Chief Executive Officer.
